METRO THEATER COMPANY PROUDLY EMBRACES 39TH SEASON

WITH A NEW PLAY, A PLAY NEW TO ST. LOUIS AND A PROVEN FAVORITE

Metro Theater Company is 39 and holding—but we're certainly not holding anything back when it comes to producing provocative plays guaranteed to engage and move audiences of all ages.

"How astonishing to be on the tipping point of the company's fourth decade," says Carol North, artistic director. "This is an exciting time!" Here are details about the new season:

- *Super Cowgirl and Mighty Miracle* is a brand new play from José Cruz González
- *Battledrum*, by Doug Cooney, ties into an exhibit at the Missouri History Museum
- Wesley Middleton's *Tomato Plant Girl* looks at bullying from a garden-fresh angle

PUBLIC PERFORMANCES

Battledrum by Doug Cooney with music by Lee Ahlin will be presented in partnership with the Missouri History Museum as part of "The Civil War in Missouri," a new exhibit that opens Nov. 11 and runs through March 16, 2013.

Full of lively action, rich music, evocative costumes, and just the right amount of humor, *Battledrum* offers young people a point of entry into the complexities of the war that divided our nation. (For more on the play, see Page 3.) This is its second production in the country. North will direct.

Also, we will offer two public performances in November of our popular touring production of *Tomato Plant Girl*. For details, see the schedule on this page.

TOURING PRODUCTIONS

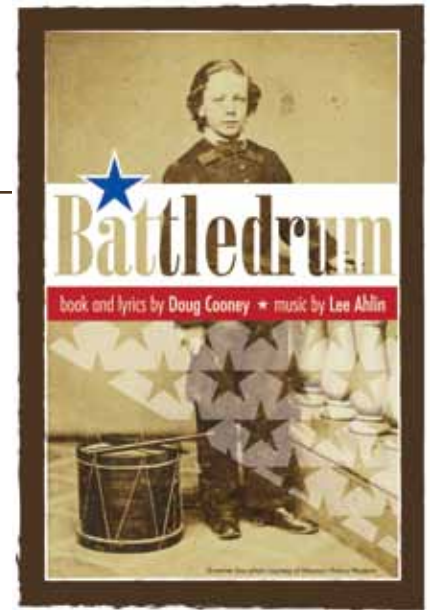
Both touring plays—*Super Cowgirl and Mighty Miracle* and *Tomato Plant Girl*—are "incredibly

timely" in their themes and issues, says North.

The world premiere of *Super Cowgirl and Mighty Miracle* is the result of a two-year collaboration with González. "José has a gift for crafting deceptively simple stories that are in fact very complex. That is an indication of the trust he has in his audience." (For a conversation with González, see Page 3.) North will direct the play.

Tomato Plant Girl tells a cautionary tale about Little Girl, a newcomer, who looks for guidance from Bossy Best Friend—up to a point. The production has been warmly received by thousands of young playgoers at schools, libraries and community centers throughout Missouri and Illinois.

North sums up: "Whether you think of 39 years as young or old, our 2011-12 season promises to be exciting. We hope to see you soon!"

A SUPER PLAYWRIGHT RIDES INTO TOWN

MARCHING TO THE MUSIC OF *BATTLEDRUM*

Three youngsters—one from the North, one from the South and one who lost his way on the Underground Railroad—find themselves working as drummer boys on the front lines of the Civil War.

What were their lives like?

The answer is in *Battledrum*, a new Metro Theater Company production that ties in with the Missouri History Museum's exhibit "The Civil War in Missouri." (See www.mohistory.org) "Troops in the Civil War used drummer boys to communicate battle commands to soldiers, and this play is infused with the stirring music of those drums," says Carol North, artistic director.

Playwright Doug Cooney admits that *Battledrum* was something of a leap of faith. "This was not an unchallenging show to do for young people," he says. "In fact, it was kind of audacious."

Cooney did it, on commission for the Eckerd Theater Company in Clearwater, Florida. Cooney is a screenwriter, playwright, novelist, lyricist, and educator based in Los Angeles. He is now working on a novel adaptation of *Battledrum*, and he hopes to be in the opening-night audience with his six-year-old son.

Elizabeth Pickard, assistant director of community education and events at the History Museum, expressed excitement about the collaboration with Metro Theater Company. "*Battledrum* is a lovely play, one that will bring in students to see what the Civil War meant to children who were their age," Pickard says. "The play will provide a visceral, personal connection."

Cooney suggests that after seeing *Battledrum*, students will better understand the meaning of the artifacts on display.

José Cruz González, who wrote the inspiring and funny *Super Cowgirl and Mighty Miracle*, has written 30 plays and seen half of them produced. But even for "super" playwrights, new plays do not spring full-blown onto the stage, ready for actors to inhabit the roles.

In his most recent collaboration with Metro Theater Company, González penned five drafts over more than two years before heading into production. He savors that process and also has high praise for Metro Theater Company. "The company is so innovative and forward thinking, so committed to telling stories relevant to the community. It is an honor to work with them."

At the heart of the new play, presented by PNC Arts Alive, is an African-American grandma on a set income and her 6-year-old, mixed heritage granddaughter who needs a place to stay. "They both are stubborn and must figure out how to live with one another," González says.

Their neighborhood is full of "For Sale" signs, lots of weeds and homeless dogs. "The girl embraces a dog that later destroys her grandmother's favorite church hat," says González. "The play is about how they all come together to survive."

González also has written for PAZ, the Emmy Award-nominated television series produced by Discovery Kids for The Learning Channel. He teaches theater at California State University Los Angeles and is a member of the prestigious College of Fellows of the American Theatre.

ALONG THE 'PATHWAY' TO AN INNOVATIVE PROJECT

Metro Theater Company is one of only three major arts organizations in St. Louis invited to participate in a "New Pathways for the Arts" initiative under the direction of EmcArts, a not-for-profit organization based in New York.

Organizations were asked to identify a specific challenge that adversely affects their vitality, and then devise an innovative strategy to address that challenge. The Contemporary Art Museum and the Shakespeare Festival St. Louis are also taking part. 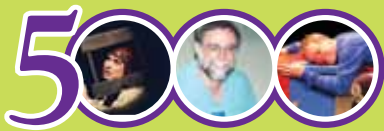

A memorial fund in Suzi's name has been established to ensure that young people have continued access to Metro Theater Company's artistic programs.

METRO THEATER COMPANY INVESTS IN EDUCATION

In addition to performing at schools throughout the region much of the year, Metro Theater Company works in schools, integrating theater arts into curriculum. "We definitely are investing in education programs," says Carol North, artistic director.

"Metro Theater Company's education programs are in such demand that the only way to meet that demand is to grow our offerings—and our department." (See related story on this page.)

Three key programs—two of them new—enhance Metro's relationships with local schools. They are:

- Building Community Through Drama
- Step Inside The Story
- Create Your Own Adventure!

BUILDING COMMUNITY THROUGH DRAMA is now in its sixth year. In this five-session classroom residency, teaching artists use non-competitive drama games and improvisation to help students build a safe, welcoming classroom. Improvisational scenarios examine teasing, exclusion, name-calling and bullying, and help students create positive strategies to deal with such problems in a safe environment.

STEP INSIDE THE STORY is our new program for students in grades K-5. They experience imaginative fun and creative play while building curricular skills through the use of story. In 60-minute sessions, our teaching artists bring stories to life through drama and creative

movement while reinforcing important literacy skills such as comprehension, vocabulary building and visualization.

CREATE YOUR OWN ADVENTURE! is our new program for students in third grade and older. Our teaching artists work with students in 60-minute sessions to experience a high-energy voyage through history, literature or science, using improvisation, role-playing and creative problem solving.



MEET METRO'S NEW EDUCATION TEAM

Metro Theater Company begins our 39th season with an all-new education team. We welcome Karen Weberman, our new education director; Ariana Moses, our resident teaching artist; and Meredyth Pederson, our teaching artist fellow.

Weberman comes to Metro from Metropolis Performing Arts Centre, where she designed and facilitated arts-based residencies and workshops in schools and organizations throughout Chicago and environs. She has taught with Northlight Theatre, Emerald City Theatre

Company, Orlando Repertory Theatre, Asolo Repertory Theatre, UCP of Central Florida and ArtsBridge America.

"I am thrilled to join the incredibly warm, intelligent, and creative team at Metro Theater Company," says Weberman. "It is my goal to develop meaningful relationships with current community partners, and continue to seek out areas of need for new education programs."

Moses has worked with the Children's Theatre Company in Minneapolis and the Papermill Touring Children's Theatre in Lincoln, New Hampshire. Pederson, our 2011-2012 teaching artist fellow, has taught creative drama and theater arts at the Lexington Children's Theatre in Lexington, Kentucky.
